

# **Plastic Free Queensferry**

We held a very successful Community meeting on 28th January with 33 people (and a baby!) coming along to find out more about the Plastic Free Community initiative. There was a great range of individuals of all ages, as well people representing a variety of different local organisations. Watch out for the next steps, which we hope will include a Mass Unwrap at a local supermarket as well as further events.

Did you know that:

There are 5000 items of marine plastic pollution per mile of beach in the UK 8,000,000 pieces of plastic pollution find their way into the ocean every day

Plastic pollution is an issue that connects the environment with all parts of society. It is something that we can take action on at every level. Only through concrete, collective, positive action will we be able to stop the flood of plastic pollution from overwhelming our world.

As a response to this, Queensferry Parish Church, as part of its Eco Congregation work, has joined in with other community groups in Queensferry to form Plastic Free Queensferry. This is part of the Plastic Free Communities initiative www.sas.org.uk/plastic-free-communities/ which has over 660 communities registered as part of the scheme.

We held our first meeting on Tuesday 28th January when we invited both individuals and representatives of a wide range of community groups and organisations to join us in pledging to reduce the number of single use plastic items we use every day. In QPC we pledged to reduce our use of single use plastic a couple of years ago, as part of our Eco Congregation work: no more throw away coffee cups, covering the Sunday morning biscuits with Beeswax wraps, asking all our hall users to not bring single use plastic items for their events. But we can do so much more as a wider congregation!

What single use plastic items do you have in your home that you could replace with alternatives? Something as simple as replacing your shampoo in a bottle with a shampoo bar makes all the difference! Take a look at the Eco Congregation board in the hall for more ideas of the changes YOU can make.

### **Prayer Group**

In the autumn we held a 6-week bible study course where we looked at prayer in the Bible. A diverse group met together for an hour a week in the 6 weeks leading up to the start of Advent and enjoyed exploring the message of the Bible and sharing the different ways the passages spoke to each of us.

We looked at how prayer is a means of communication between God and us, as through Jesus we can access our heavenly Father by means of the Holy Spirit. We learnt how a time of prayer helps us to focus our thoughts on God and listen for his message to us. From both the Old and New Testament we learn that God is faithful to us and answers our prayers, even if not in the way we expect or would like. Our short time together gave each of us encouragement in our faith journey and we learned to see things from many different viewpoints.

If you are into technology the 24-7 Prayer movement led by Pete Greig has recently launched a Bible Study app with daily Bible study and Prayer written by the leaders of 24-7.

The App is called **Lectio365** and each day we are encouraged to: Pause – to be still; Rejoice - with a Psalm and Reflect on a Bible passage; Ask – God to help us; Yield – to His will in our lives.

Each week explores a theme, as we discover how we love God through Prayer and creativity (Matt 22:37), Love one another through Justice and hospitality (Matt 22:39,) and love the world through learning and mission (Matt 28:18-20).

The app is available for both audio and reading. Why not give it a try for a week.

### **Kidz Corner**

Kids these days. Do they even listen? I know I've asked this question to myself when a group I'm meant to be leading is continuing to cartwheel around a room rather than following instructions. Maybe you've asked yourself this question after telling your child to put their shoes on for the thousandth time as you're heading out the door. But if you've spent any time around kids recently then you've also had opportunities to confirm that they are listening, because you'll have had the privilege of listening to them.

It is good news that kids are listening, but sometimes a bit scary too! Possibly you can share a story of a time a child was listening to you, but misunderstood what you meant in the funniest of ways. Or perhaps you have had an "oops" moment when you discovered children were listening when you didn't actually want them to be.

Or maybe you, like me, find yourself confronted with kids' really big and important questions and impressions about God. One child asked me, after listening to me talking about God's power, "If God is so powerful, why doesn't he stop climate change?" When I asked another group of children, "Where do you think God is?" they answered, "before us, beside us, and behind us," recalling the words to a song sung in worship the week before. Another child wondered aloud that Abraham must've talked with God a lot to be able to recognise his voice when he heard God speak. Kids have had me researching best answers for describing what God looks like and how God was made because sometimes "we don't know" or "he wasn't" doesn't cut it. Because kids really listen, they push me to be more accurate in my teaching and more engaged with my own faith.

Would you like this push too?

Join us on Sunday mornings where kids are listening to key stories from the Bible and how they fit together as one narrative about God and God's people. The whole church is coming along for this journey through scripture and I look forward to the deeper understanding we'll all develop along the way.





### **Exploring the God Question**

There is a widely held view that science and religion are incompatible, and that real scientists cannot also believe in God. But did you know that over 60% of Nobel Prize winners between 1901 and 2000 were Christians.

Now a DVD resource has become available based on an international TV documentary series. Scientists from both sides of the debate are interviewed, including: Francis Collins, Richard Dawkins, Sam Harris, John Lennox, Steven Pinker, John Polkinghorne and Steven Weinberg. In six half-hour episodes, the DVD programmes cover three themes - The Cosmos, Life and Evolution, Mind and Consciousness.

Early in the new year of 2020 we're going to be running a new series of Exploring the God Question over six evenings. Each evening will begin with refreshments. We'll then view the 30-minute video for the evening and have time for questions and discussion. Having no, or very little, scientific background has not proved to be an obstacle in following the narrative and contributing in the discussion time.
